





CESKY KRUMLOV

Český Krumlov is a city in the South Bohemia region of the Czech Republic. It's bisected by the Vltava River, and dominated by its 13th-century castle. The castle has Gothic, Renaissance and baroque elements, an 11-hectare garden and an original 17th-century baroque theater. There are panoramic views of the old town and the river from the top of its round bell tower.







ODISSI DANCERS


Young Odissi dancers, dressed in their rich traditional costumes, get ready to perform. They are seen wearing coloured sari made of local silk decorated with traditional and local designs. Silver jewellery adorns her head, ear, neck, arms and wrists. Odissi is one of the pre-eminent classical dance forms of India which originated in the Hindu temples of the eastern coastal state of Odisha in India. Its theoretical base traces back to 'Natya Shastra', the ancient Sanskrit Hindu text on the performing arts.





OLD TOWN SQUARE, PRAGUE

Old Town Square, in Czech known as Staroměstské náměstí, Is the central square of the historic part of Prague. The square, located between Wenceslas Square and Charles Bridge, is one of the greatest tourist attractions of the Czech capital. The square features buildings belonging to various architectural styles, including the Gothic Church of Our Lady before Týn, which has been the main church of this part of the city since the 14th century. The Christmas Markets in Old Town Square are the largest Christmas markets in the Czech Republic and are visited by hundreds of thousands of visitors.





RABARI MARKET

Rabari women in their richly decorated dresses jostle in the local marketplace in a village in Gujarat. The Rabaris are an indigenous tribal caste of nomadic cattle, camel herders and shepherds that live in the northwest region of India, primarily in the states of Gujarat, Punjab and Rajasthan. Emroidery is a vital, living and evolving expression of the crafted textile tradition of the Rabaris. As far back as the group's collective memory stretches, Rabari women have diligently embroidered textiles as an expression of creativity, aesthetics and identity.







ASTRONOMICAL CLOCK TOWER, PRAGUE

The Astronomical Clock (Pražský orloj) is built into one side of the Old Town Hall Tower (Staroměstská radnice) at the Old Town Square. The clock dates from the 15th century. To fully appreciate its intricate construction, join the crowd in front of the tower to watch the procession of the Twelve Apostles: on the hour, every hour a trap door opens and Christ marches out ahead of his disciples, while the skeleton of death tolls the bell to a statue of a defiant Turk. Below the Astronomical Clock are 12 medallions with the signs of the zodiac, added by Josef Manes in 1865.





HOLI IN VRINDAVAN

Holi, the Festival of Colour, is a Hindu spring festival and is celebrated in India since a very long time. The Banke-Bihari Temple in Vrindavan is one such place to enjoy the festivities as it hosts a week-long Holi celebration here. Vrindavan Holi is played with coloured water and gulal (a form of colour made using organic substances like flowers and kesar). Priests sprinkle colours on everyone using buckets, water guns, etc. and the whole atmosphere is becomes more lively with music (bhajans) in the background as people dance to the tunes and enjoy the colors.





STRAHOV LIBRARY, PRAGUE

The origin of the collections in the Strahov Library goes back to the 12th century, when the Premonstratensian monastery was founded there. The development of the library was interrupted several times through the centuries. After 1950, the library was incorporated into the Memorial of National Literature. The Strahov Library contains over 200,000 volumes, including over 3,000 manuscripts and 1,500 first prints stored in a special depository.






GAJAN FESTIVAL

Devotees march through the village with painted faces and armed with traditional weapons like swords, tridents, harpoons etc., (resembling the demoniac aides of Lord Shiva) and dance to the traditional beats of drums as they collect alms from door to door in a village in West Bengal. Gajan is a festival celebrated during the year-end and is based on the vernacular (Bengali) calendar. Gajan spans around a week and people observe this festival to collect new energy for the ensuing new-year. One of the central themes of this festival is to derive satisfaction through pain, devotion and sacrifice.





CITY OF BRIDGES, PRAGUE

As the Vltava River meanders through the historic town, it is crossed by a series of bridges, each of which have their own cultural or architectural charm. From the famous Charles Bridge and the historic Legion Bridge to the Art Nouveau Čechův Bridge and the modern Troja Bridge, there are some distinctively beautiful and unique bridges in Prague. It is said that there are over three hundred bridges in the city. Eighteen of them span across river Vltava, and hundreds of other lead over many smaller rivers and brooks, and valleys.








PULAKELLI DANCE DURING ONAM

On the fourth day of Onam celebrations (Nalaam Onam), performers painted like tigers and hunters in bright yellow, red and black dance to the beats of instruments like Udukku and Thakil in Thrissur district of Kerala Pulikkali is a recreational folk art from Kerala. It is performed by trained artists to entertain people on the occasion of Onam, an annual harvest festival, celebrated mainly in the Indian state of Kerala. Literal meaning of Pulikkali is the 'play of the tigers'; hence the performance revolves around the theme of tiger hunting.







CHARLES BRIDGE, PRAGUE

Charles Bridge is the most famous bridge in Prague, which began construction in 1357 under the auspices of King Charles IV, and completed in the beginning of the 15th century. But it wasn't known as Charles Bridge until 1841. It was originally called the Stone Bridge or the Prague Bridge. The bridge replaced the old Judith Bridge built 1158–1172 that had been badly damaged by a flood in 1342. Named after King Charles IV, for hundreds of years it was the only structure connecting the two banks of the Vltava River. Nowadays it's a popular place for a romantic walk at sunset, when lanterns light up the stone walkway.





FIRE AND DEVOTION

Agni (fire) plays an important role in various aspects of the Hindu Tradition. It is both the creator and destroyed of life, and those that follow the Hindu tradition recognize this fact through several of their rituals and practices. A devotee is seen during a ritual where fire ignited by the burning of camphor is symbolic of how the ego should melt along with the camphor so that the soul could become one with the supreme.




GRAND JURY
